

A little about GoodNews Church


We meet together every Sunday because we love Jesus Christ and proclaim Him as Lord of our lives (2 Corinthians 4:5). The Bible commands believers to meet regularly together as well as continuing in their own personal devotions with God (Hebrews 10:25).





2 Corinthians 4:5 For we do not preach ourselves, but Jesus Christ as Lord, and ourselves as your servants for Jesus' sake.


Hebrews 10:25 Let us not give up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but let us encourage one another--and all the more as you see the Day approaching.



During our meeting time we will sing songs. These songs express our thankfulness, our praise, our joy, and our love to Jesus (Colossians 3:16). We do this in a very personal way, often expressing it with emotion, as we would naturally do with those we love (Psalms 101:1). God gave us the Bible to be able to know Him better, to know about Him as well as to know what He requires and enjoys (1 John 3:22).




Colossians 3:16 Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly as you teach and admonish one another with all wisdom, and as you sing psalms, hymns and spiritual songs with gratitude in your hearts to God.



Psalms 101:1 I will sing of your love and justice; to you, O LORD, I will sing praise.

1 John 3:22 We obey his commands and do what pleases him.

The Bible tells us to praise God with our whole heart (Psalms 9:1), with everything we have. We're told to shout and clap (Psalms 47:1), to raise our hands (Psalms 63:4), to dance (Psalms 150:4), to kneel (Psalms 95:6), and even to lie down before the Lord (1 Kings 18:39). Praising God is very interactive thing to do. (Psalms 22:3).



Psalms 9:1 I will praise you, O LORD, with all my heart; I will tell of all your wonders.

Psalms 47:1 Clap your hands, all you nations; shout to God with cries of joy.

Psalms 63:4 I will praise you as long as I live, and in your name I will lift up my hands.


Psalms 150:4 Praise him with tambourine and dancing.

Psalms 95:6 Come, let us bow down in worship, let us kneel before the LORD our Maker.

1 Kings 18:39 They fell prostrate and cried, "The LORD--he is God!"

Psalms 22:3 Yet you are enthroned as the Holy One; you are the praise of Israel.

Sometimes during the singing there may be times of spontaneous calls of love and worship to our Lord Jesus (Psalms 96:1). These may include languages that we do not know, but which are given to believers by the power of the Holy Spirit (1 Corinthians 12:10). To quickly explain this, it can be thought of as a way that God allows us to express our love to Him when we get to the place that our words just don't seem enough anymore (Romans 8:26).




Psalms 96:1 Sing to the LORD a new song; sing to the LORD, all the earth.

1 Corinthians 12:10 To another miraculous powers, to another prophecy, to another distinguishing between spirits, to another speaking in different kinds of tongues, and to still another the interpretation of tongues.


Romans 8:26 In the same way, the Spirit helps us in our weakness. We do not know what we ought to pray for, but the Spirit himself intercedes for us with groans that words cannot express.

As a rule, if a person speaks out in an unknown language so that it is heard and holds the attention of the meeting, it is important that we wait for the Lord to give someone the interpretation of that language. This is so that everyone may understand what has been said (1 Corinthians 14:27 and 1 Corinthians 14:6).




1 Corinthians 14:27 If anyone speaks in a tongue, two--or at the most three-should speak, one at a time, and someone must interpret.


1 Corinthians 14:6 Now, brothers, if I come to you and speak in tongues, what good will I be to you, unless I bring you some revelation or knowledge or prophecy or word of instruction?




During the meeting the Holy Spirit may also prompt people to speak out in English. Often this is a prayer to the Lord. They will lead others in the prayer, and it usually concludes with an Amen. Amen means — So be it — Yes Lord — We agree (Jeremiah 28:6).



Jeremiah 28:6 He said, "Amen! May the LORD do so! May the LORD fulfill the words you have prophesied.




Another way the Holy Spirit prompts people to speak is called prophecy (Romans 12:6). This may be an instruction, a revelation, a picture, or an interpretation. God uses all these things to encourage people, to build people up, and to strengthen them (1 Corinthians 14:3). Prophetic words must be weighed by the leaders in the meeting (1 Corinthians 14:29).




Romans 12:6 We have different gifts, according to the grace given us. If a man's gift is prophesying, let him use it in proportion to his faith.

- 1 Corinthians 14:3 But everyone who prophesies speaks to men for their strengthening, encouragement and comfort.
- 1 Corinthians 14:29 Two or three prophets should speak, and the others should weigh carefully what is said.



There may be other times when people are led to bring a reading from the Bible. We believe that the Bible is the Word of God and contains all that we need to know about God, and to know God (2 Timothy 3:16). The Bible is one of the ways that God speaks to people and He uses it to confirm what He is speaking through prophecy

(1 Timothy 5:21). We believe that the Bible is the absolute authority in all matters (Psalms 138:2).




2 Timothy 3:16 -17 All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness, so that the man of God may be thoroughly equipped for every good work.

1 Timothy 5:21 I charge you, in the sight of God and Christ Jesus and the elect angels, to keep these instructions without partiality, and to do nothing out of favouritism.

Psalms 138:2 I will ... praise your name for your love and your faithfulness, for you have exalted above all things your name and your word.

We also offer opportunity for prayer. If anyone has a need, sickness, or anything that they would like prayer for, we would be pleased to pray for you (Luke 9:2 and James 5:14).
